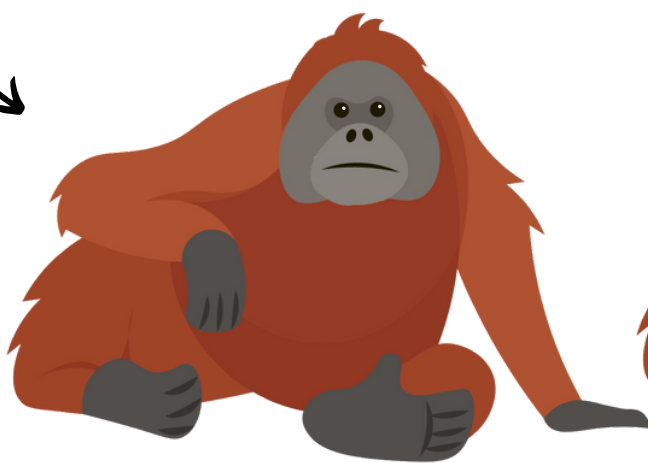

MAKE YOUR OWN ORANGUTAN

YOU WILL NEED

- 2 empty toilet roll holders (1 for the body and 1 for the arms)
- Orange paper (or colour your own)
- Colouring pens or pencils
- Glue stick or sticky tape
- Scissors (ask an adult to help!)



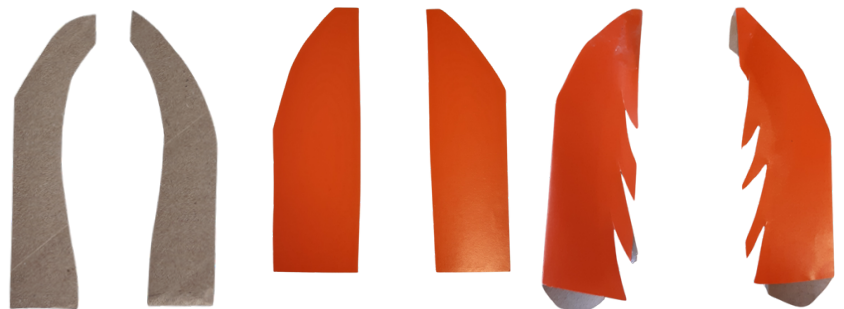
1. MAKE THE BODY

- Wrap a piece of orange paper around one toilet roll holder or colour it in.
- Stick it down with glue or tape.
- Tuck the ends of the paper inside the roll.
- This is your orangutan's body!



2. MAKE THE ARMS

- Cut the second toilet roll holder in half and cut out 2 arms.
- Use the picture to help you shape the arms.
- Cut two pieces of orange paper a bit wider than the arms.
- Cut little zigzags or snips along the straight edge, to make the orangutan's furry hair.
- Glue or tape the paper on to the cardboard arms.
- Leave a bit of cardboard showing at the end and shape into a curve; this will be the hands!



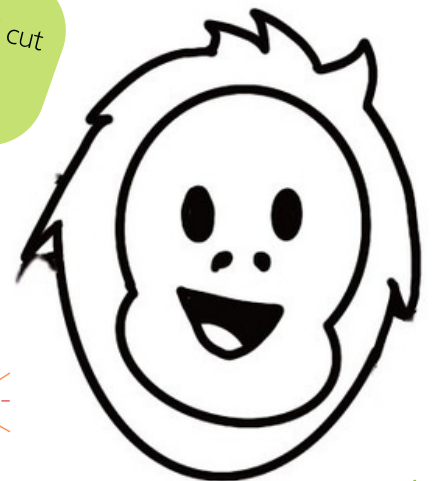
3. ATTACH THE ARMS

- Bend the top of each arm a little.
- Stick them to the sides of the body.

4. MAKE THE FACE

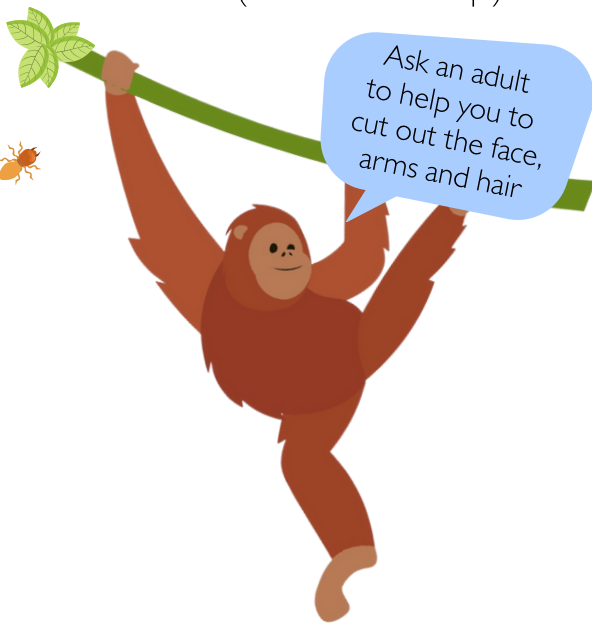
- Use the orangutan face we've given you.
- Colour it in using your pens or pencils.
- Cut it out carefully (ask an adult to help if you need to).
- Stick the face onto the top of your orangutan's body.

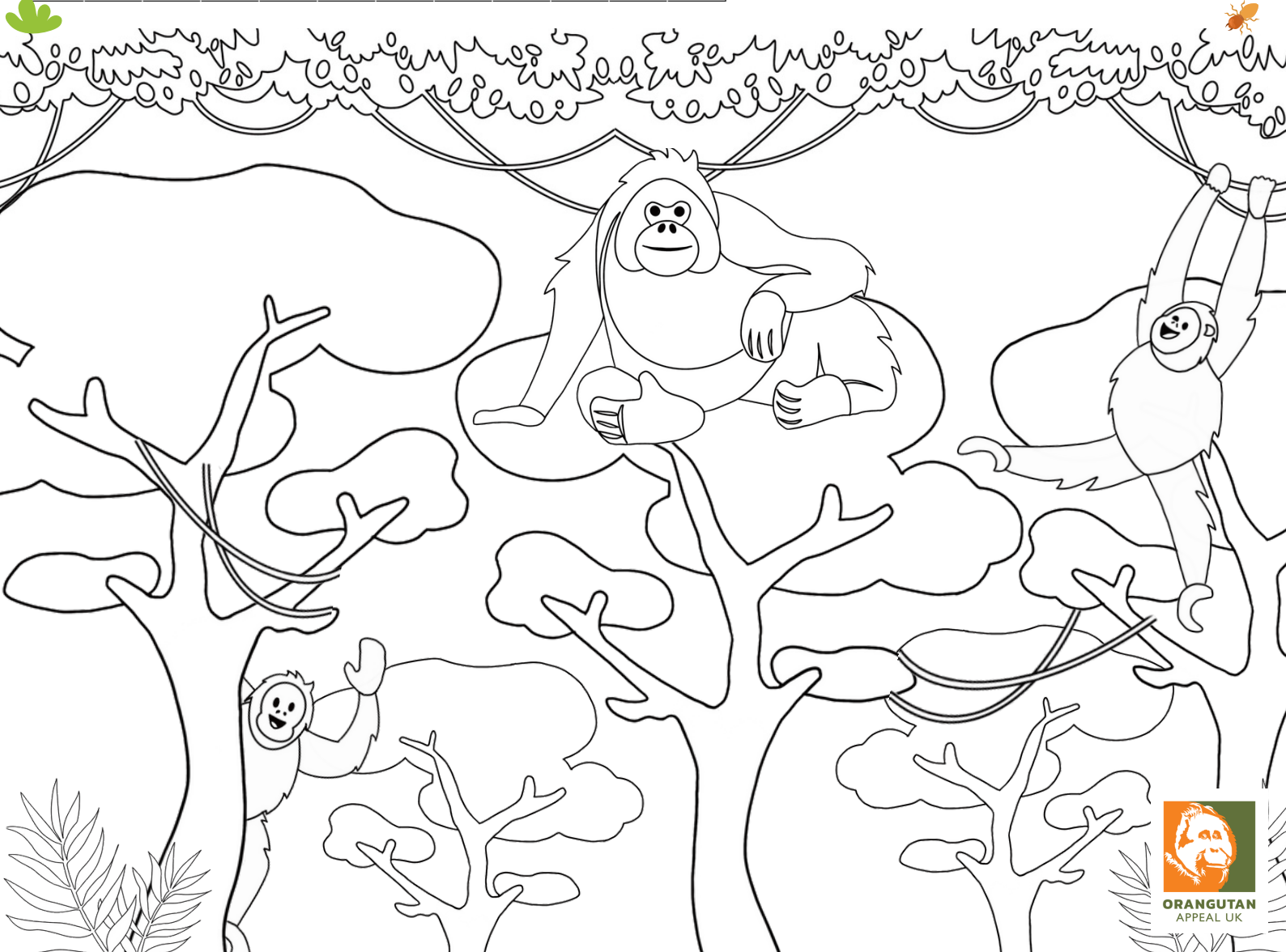

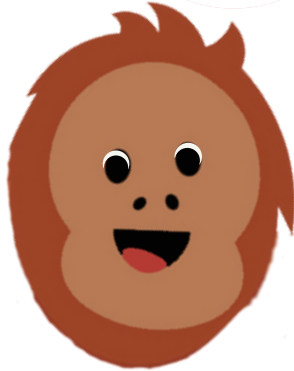
